Dr. Jonathan Benjamin-Alvarado is a Senior Research Associate at the University of Georgia's Center for International Trade and Security. He is currently conducting research on Cuba's efforts to develop a nuclear energy capability and broader infrastructure and energy development issues. Since 1992, he has visited Cuba six times for field research on the nuclear energy development program and has conducted interviews with a number of senior government officials in Cuba's nuclear and related agencies. He has published several articles on the subject and is finishing a book titled, Power to the People: The Cuban Nuclear Energy Program (Routledge, 1999, forthcoming). Dr. Benjamin-Alvarado has received research and travel grants form the Amos Foundation, The MacArthur Foundation, The Ford Foundation, The Johns Hopkins University Cuba Exchange Program, and the University of Georgia for his work on Cuba. He is Principal Investigator of "Energy Options for a Developing Cuba: Implications for the United States," a collaborative study between the University of Georgia and the Atlantic Council of the U.S. He received his M.A. in International Policy Studies at the Monterey Institute of International Studies, and a Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Georgia.
